# Cambridge Independent SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY AWARDS

The 2019 Cambridge Independent Science and Technology Awards are now open for nominations.

A celebration of the finest achievements across a range of sectors, the awards are now in their third year.

Supported by a stellar cast of sponsors, the event will take place at the Bradfield Centre, the exciting £20million deep tech hub on Cambridge Science Park, on October 30.

The 2018 ceremony brought together some of the brightest and best entrepreneurs, scientists, researchers and business leaders in Cambridge.

Winners included Martin Frost, of CMR Surgical, who was named CEO of the Year, GeoSpock, which won Technology Company of the Year, and Microbotica, as Life Science Company of the Year.

Nominations will close on July 31 and a judging panel, chaired by Paul and featuring experts from across a range of science and technology fields, will then

New categories this year include STEM Initiative of the Year, designed to highlight exceptional work in engaging young people with science, technology, engineering or mathematics.
